Board of Fire Commissioners Fire District No. 4 Jackson Township, New Jersey

Minutes of Meeting Held July 14, 2022

Notice of the time, date, location and agenda of this meeting to the extent then known, was duly published in the district's official newspapers, posted on its official bulletin board and filed with the office of the municipal clerk at least forty-eight hours in advance of this meeting. This meeting is being conducted in accordance with the terms and provisions of the "Open Meetings Act" of the State of New Jersey.

<u>Call to Order</u>: the meeting was called to order by Commissioner Couceiro at 6:15 pm. Board Attorney Braslow read "Open Meetings Act" statement. All participated in the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was observed.

<u>Roll Call</u>: Commissioners Couceiro, Jamison, and Goldman were present. Commissioners O'Brien and Torres were absent. Board Attorney Braslow was present via remote communications.

Minutes: Minutes from the June 9, 2022 meeting were tabled due to a lack of quorum of attendees from the June 9, 2022 meeting.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> The bill list as well as the report (a copy of which is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference) as of July 14, 2022 was presented and left on table for public review. Commissioner Jamison read the cash balances into the record. Commissioner Goldman motioned to accept the Treasurer's report and pay the bills, seconded by Commissioner Jamison. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

Legal Report: Board Attorney Braslow reported remotely on the Capital Referendum Bill (setting dates for meeting). It appears that the bill has been successfully killed. Generator Bid was prepared. It was been reviewed by Cheryl. Minimum of ten days from date of publication. Board was in agreement that bids will be accepted at the next meeting (August 11, 2022) at 6:30 pm. Commissioner Goldman motioned to accept the date of August 11, 2022 at 6:30 pm to accept generator bids, seconded by Commissioner Goldman. passed by unanimous consent. Activity of Division of Fire Safety. There will be many cuts to budget (one-third), there may have to be layoffs of employees of Fire Safety. Commissioner Jamison advised that there are rumors regarding the consolidation of the fire districts. Board Attorney Braslow reviewed the process with the Board of how to do this: 1. Mutual Agreement (of all the districts); 2. Petition process. The process is very complicated especially with Civil Service employees. Two issues: will the debt be paid and will there still be fire protection. There is a lot of pre-work to be done before the topic goes to the Township. It is a very complex process. Board Attorney Braslow recommends that a meeting be held with all districts so that he may explain the process to all the districts. Commissioner Jamison advised that the Jackson Township

advertised for a Fire Official. The process is not a short process, it can take years. Tax rates will change – some districts will have to pay more.

Commissioner Torres entered the meeting at 6:33 pm.

Executive Session - Commissioner Couceiro motioned to accept the Resolution to take the Board into an executive session for the purpose of discussion of personnel matters seconded by Commissioner Goldman. Subject matter to be released when it is no longer considered privileged. Motion passed by unanimous consent at 6:35 p.m. The executive session ended at 6:45 p.m. and the Board reconvened continuing with the agenda.

<u>Truck & Building/Career Department Report</u> – read by Captain Leonard (a copy of the written report is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference). He will send the report to Board Attorney Braslow tomorrow.

Board Attorney Braslow left the meeting at 6:54 pm.

Commissioner Couceiro motioned pay the invoice for Wolf's Den Nursery for the purposed of grass/ruts repair on side of driveway at 7 Rococo Court Jackson, seconded by Commissioner Jamison (a copy of the invoice is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference). Motion passed by unanimous consent. Commissioner Jamison asked if the homeowner could submit the invoice to their homeowner and then reimburses the Board - either through the Fire Official or the Captain. Commissioner Couceiro motioned to approve the purchase of five (5) fifty foot (50ft) lengths of five inch (5") red rubber jacket to be added to the hose order, seconded by Commissioner Goldman. Motion passed by unanimous consent. Captain Leonard did not yet speak to Peterbilt. He is working on his to do list. Garage door is still making humming noises - it needs to be serviced. Commissioner Torres will be doing a walkthrough with Chief O'Hara (either tonight or tomorrow) with regard to deficiencies. Commissioner Torres will send Captain Leonard an email after the list has been compiled.

Chief's Report: Chief Trask O'Hara - absent. Written report (a copy of the written report is attached to the original minutes and made a part thereof) was read by Commissioner Torres. Discussion on meeting with Fire Fighter #1 RE: ScottPacks. Discussion Solar Drill – cost is \$1000 per class. Discussion on payment. Finances to be discussed later per Commissioner Torres. Further discussion on Scott packs. Commissioner Couceiro motioned to approve going out to bid for Scott packs, dependent on approval from Board Attorney Braslow and Cheryl, seconded by Commissioner Goldman. Motion passed by unanimous consent. Roll Call vote: Ayes: Couceiro, Goldman, Jamison, Torres. Nays: none; Abstain: none; Absent: O'Brien.

<u>President's Report</u>: read by President Chelli (A copy of which is attached to the original minutes and made a part thereof). #5401: damage from accident – truck to be reviewed after meeting. Board was in agreement with use of the Station #2 picnic area to work on Eagle Scout project provided President Chelli is satisfied with the adult supervision requirement.

Work Order Requests: Captain Leonard advised that he is working on his list. Everything is to be documented in ERS. Captain Leonard will work with John to train everyone to do it.

Fire Bureau Report: read by Fire Official O'Brien (the written report is attached to the original minutes and made a part hereof). Board was in agreement that FO O'Brien is able to order supplies for National Night out and Fire Prevention not to exceed the amount of \$3,000.

Old Business: FF Porth reported orally that #5421 is listed as "on time" but that could change when they update their listing at the end of the week. He to advise Board of any changes. Board expects layout of old truck vs. new truck to be similar in nature. FF Porth further reported that currently lead-time for Sutphen a new truck (from the time of contracts signed to delivery) is now two (2) years.

Fire Expo to be held in Columbus Ohio. Discussion on driving vs. flying. It may be more cost effective to drive with gas & tolls. E-Z Pass: Commissioner Couceiro advised to attach a credit card to tag and it will be fine.

Commissioner Couceiro motioned to approve a Resolution appointing the firm of Blaney Donohue & Weinberg LLC as labor attorney for the Board, seconded by Commissioner Goldman. Motion passed by unanimous consent (Ayes: Couceiro, Goldman, Jamison, Torres; Nays: none; Abstain: none; Absent: O'Brien).

<u>Executive Session</u> - Commissioner Couceiro motioned to accept the Resolution to take the Board into an executive session for the purpose of discussion of personnel matters seconded by Commissioner Goldman. Subject matter to be released when it is no longer considered privileged. Motion passed by unanimous consent at 7:35 p.m. The executive session ended at 8:00 p.m. and the Board reconvened continuing with the agenda.

<u>Adjournment</u>: With no other business to come before the Board, Commissioner Goldman motioned to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Commissioner Jamison. Meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m. by Commissioner Torres.

ROOF INSPECTION - FLAT ROOF

The findings of my inspection of June 21,2022 of the flat roof shows the following issues that need to be addressed.

Section 1- Roof drains show many loose granules collecting around the drains and scuppers preventing proper drainage and causing ponding which over time erode and will cause leaks.







Section 2- Wall Flashings-Seams on wall flashing are cracked and failing in many locations, they have been repaired previously with various materials [tar and other sealants] and the repairs are not holding up.









Section 3- Main roof field- Many seams have split, has many blisters that if they are not leaking presently, they will before long. These repairs need to be done properly using the same materials as the original roof installations. This roof has been patched in several areas with various types of materials, they are ineffective as the roof continues to leak.
