# Board of Fire Commissioners Fire District No. 4 Jackson Township, New Jersey

Minutes of Meeting Held December 10, 2020 Special Meeting Time: 6 pm – 9pm

**SPECIAL MEETING CALL TO ORDER**: Board Attorney Youssouf read the Resolution to call a special meeting for December 10, 2020 from 6 pm and 9 pm for the purpose of soliciting voter authorization to purchase one tractor, one general utility vehicle and firefighting appliances at a total combined cost not to exceed \$ 340,000 to be paid from existing capital reserve funds included in the 2021 budget. Resolution to serve as ballot – it has been copied and put in the Commissioners' meeting room where the voting is to take place. Special meeting was called to order at 6:03 pm.

<u>Call to Order</u>- the meeting was called to order by Chairman Torres at 6:03 pm. Board Attorney Youssouf declared that the special meeting has been convened and the polls are open. All participated in the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was observed. Commissioner Jamison asked if the truck could be ordered if the election results were positive – yes, per Board Attorney Youssouf. Commissioner Jamison also confirmed with Commissioner Couceiro that there is a 2017 Ford 520 with plow and cap for sale by the Volunteer First Aid Squad – to be a purchase between non-profit entities.

Roll Call: Commissioners Couceiro, Jamison, Torres and Goldman were present. Commissioner O'Brien was absent at roll call – he entered the meeting at 6:23 pm. Board Attorney Youssouf was also present.

<u>Minutes</u>: Commissioner Goldman motioned to approve the minutes of the November 12, 2020 General meeting with one correction (under Roll Call: Commissioner Goldman was present, Commissioner Torres was absent), seconded by Commissioner Jamison. Motion passed by majority vote (one abstention: Commissioner Torres due to his absence).

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> –The bill list as well as the report (a copy of which is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference) as of December 10, 2020 was presented and left on table for public review. Commissioner Jamison read the cash balances into the record. Commissioner Goldman motioned to accept the Treasurer's report, seconded by Commissioner Couceiro. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

Legal Report: Board Attorney Youssouf reported to the Board that the Election was underway and that it would continue until 9 pm. He further advised that the regular business meeting can be closed at any time the Board chooses. Board Attorney Youssouf provided copies of the Resolution that was passed as a Resolution in Title declaring personal property to be excess and authorizing its sale or disposal (a copy of which is attached to and incorporated herein by reference). Discussion – need to have two poll workers. Mark & Faith Reynolds are serving as poll workers at today's special meeting election. Cpt. Reynolds to

provide hose list for excess property resolution. Fire District Budget Resolution copies were distributed to Board members and read by Board Attorney Youssouf. This Resolution is to introduce the 2021 Annual Budget. Commissioner Goldman motioned to accept the Resolution and seconded by Commissioner Couceiro. Motion passed by unanimous consent (a copy of the Resolution is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference). Board Attorney Youssouf will prepare publication notifications and send out. Each district does its own Budget Adopting Resolution. Commissioner Jamison asked about balloting. Board Attorney Youssouf advised that everyone is to receive a ballot via mail. It will be costly: approximately \$ 12,800. Can something be done with the Fire District Association to change the process? Commissioner O'Brien entered the meeting at 6:23 pm. Board Attorney Youssouf is pessimistic about relief from the state mandate. Discussion on making election costs excluded from CAP. Craig Almack is the VP of State Fire Association. Cheryl to provide his contact information to Commissioner Torres.

<u>Truck & Building/Career Department Report</u> – read by Commissioner Goldman (a copy of the written report is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference). Unit #5444 has been stripped and Fire Official Burmeister obtained replacement title.

<u>Chief's Report</u> - read by Chief Trask O'Hara (a copy of the written report is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference.) Cheryl advised that career staff has \$4,000 left in technology and \$2,000 left in office supplies. They are requesting authorization to purchase two (2) computers and two (2) desks. After discussion, Board was in agreement to purchase requested items at a cost not to exceed \$4,000.00. Striping/Pavement – Cheryl reported that Lt. Leonard advised her that we now have to wait for warmer weather (to be done at both buildings). Patching was started at Station #2 – but it was too cold to complete.

<u>President's Report</u> — read by President Steve Linde (a copy of the written report is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference). Chief O'Hara advised that the Station #2 toilet is leaking and there are issues with some of the outdoor lights. Both issues are being worked on by career staff.

<u>Fire Bureau</u>: Fire Official Burmeister was not present (a copy of the report is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference).

**Work Orders**: addressed in the Truck & Building/Career Department report.

#### Old Business/Correspondence:


Old Business: Storage options for Board documents: Option of enclosing area off banquet room, clearing mechanical room, to have outside locking doors etc. has been discussed with volunteers, career staff and Board members. Purging of files – discussion. There are state guidelines as to what has to be kept on file, digitalize records, etc. Board was in agreement. Vehicles: discussion. Safety Officer not appointed in 2020 – to be appointed for 2021. Command vehicle not included in 2021 budget – needs voter approval prior to being added to budget. Discussion – has to be approved by a capital

question on the ballot. #44 has been sold. Board has decided to keep #27 for Board Attorney Youssouf's call to Jackson Township manager has not yet been returned. Commissioner Torres will wait until after the New Year to contact the Mayor's office again (RE: purchase of vehicle). Blaze: will price be honored? Commissioner Torres will contact Kevin to confirm the price. February referendum to include: Chief's command vehicle and to purchase new pumper – a triple combination pumper not to exceed \$550,000 and fire command vehicle not to exceed \$80,000. Board Attorney Youssouf advised that the Board must pass a Resolution in January 2021 to have these items included on the February 2021 ballot. Board requested that the two ballot questions be combined into one question; to be purchased through state contract. Cares Act: Commissioner Torres reported that Kenny Esposito has been working on it. Board will be getting reimbursements. They did have questions regarding the payroll form. Cheryl will help Kenny with the form. Cheryl will get someone to do tiles at Station #2. She will void the \$7,000 check to contractor since he has not done the work. Issues with the generator to be documented – date to be located for insurance purposes. Shoreline to be notified of repair needed to hopper.

New Business: Line Item Transfers: Commissioner Couceiro motioned to approve the Resolution in Title to authorize line item transfers within the budget as per the attached list, seconded by Commissioner O'Brien. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

Public Session: none

Adjournment: With no other business to come before the Board, Commissioner Goldman motioned to accept the Resolution to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Commissioner O'Brien. Motion passed by unanimous consent. Meeting adjourned 7:51 pm. Special meeting election remains open until 9 pm.

#### Jackson Township FD No. 4

FISCAL YEAR: January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget for Jackson Township FD No. 4 (the 'Fire District') for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2021 and ending December 31, 2021 has been presented before the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District at its open public meeting of December 10, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the budget as introduced is in compliance with the Property Tax Levy Cap Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.44 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget as introduced reflects Total Revenues of \$2,337,577.75 which includes an amount to be raised by taxation of \$1,825,920.53 and Total Appropriations of \$2,337,577.75; and

WHEREAS, the amount to be raised by taxation to support the district budget shall be the amount to be certified to the assessor of the municipality to be assessed against the taxable property in the district, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-79. Such amount shall be equal to the amount of the total appropriations set forth in the budget minus the total amount surplus and miscellaneous revenues set forth in the budget; and

WHEREAS, in calculating the amount to be raised by taxation, the Fire District has taken into account the assessed valuation of taxable property in the Fire District;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District, at an open public meeting held exember 10, 2020 that the Annual Budget, including all related schedules, of the Fire District for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2021 and ending December 31, 2021 is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the anticipated revenues as reflected in the Annual Budget are of sufficient amount to meet all proposed expenditures/expenses and all covenants, terms and provisions as stipulated in the Fire District's outstanding debt obligations, capital lease arrangements, service contracts, and other pledged agreements; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District will consider the Annual Budget for adoption on January 14, 2021.
