Minutes of Meeting Held
November 10, 2016

Notice of the time, date, location and agenda of this meeting to the extent then known, was duly published at least forty-eight hours in advance of this meeting, by posting on the official bulletin board and by publications in the official newspapers of the Board. This meeting is being conducted in accordance with the terms and provisions of the "Open Meetings Act" of the State of New Jersey

Call to Order- The meeting was called to order by Chairman Rich Leonard at 8:05 pm. "Open Meetings Act" statement was read by Board Attorney Youssouf. All participated in the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was observed.

Roll Call: Commissioners Bollentin, Goldman, Leonard, Ruditsky and Torres were present. Board Attorney Youssouf was present also.

Minutes: Commissioner Goldman motioned to approve the minutes of the October 13, 2016 General meeting as presented, seconded by Commissioner Bollentin. Motion passed by majority vote with Commissioner Ruditsky abstaining due to his absence.

Swearing In: Board Attorney Youssouf administered the oath of Firefighter for Jackson Township Fire District #4 to Richard Marrero.

Treasurer's Report –The report and bill list (a copy of which is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference) as of November 10, 2016 was read by Commissioner Torres. Commissioner Ruditsky motioned to accept the treasurer's report as read and to pay the bills as read, seconded by Commissioner Goldman. Motion passed by unanimous vote.

Legal Report – Board Attorney Youssouf reviewed the schedule for the budget with state deadlines. Intro to budget: State deadline: 12/20 – our meeting date: 12/8/16; Public hearing: State deadline: 1/24/17 – our meeting date: 1/12/17. Election date: third Saturday of February 2017 (2/18/17). Board Attorney Youssouf recommended that a Capital Question for Phase II at Station #2 be included on the ballot. Bond Referendum questions would need to be voted on by the Board at the December meeting in order for it to be placed on the ballot. After discussion, Commissioner Torres motioned to accept a Resolution scheduling a workshop session for November 16, 2016 at 7:30 pm to be held at Station #1, seconded by Commissioner Ruditsky. Motion passed by unanimous consent (Ayes: Bollentin, Goldman, Leonard, Ruditsky, Torres; No: none; Abstain: none; Absent: none). Board Attorney Youssouf to prepare notice for insertion.

Truck & Building/Career Department Report – read by Commissioner Goldman (a copy of which is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference).

Fire Bureau: read by Commissioner Goldman. A copy of the Fire Bureau's report is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference.

Chief's Report – Verbal report given by Chief Michael Lubertazzi. All is going well. He inquired about the request to the Board regarding the recliners. Board was in agreement to hold off.

President's Report – President Bob Booth reported that he is waiting for the annual appeal letter from Affiliated. Fire Service Agreement was raised. Board Attorney Youssouf was awaiting the final amount from the Board. Fire Company is expecting more background check information for a potential new member.

Work Orders: up to date.

Old Business/Correspondence:

Correspondence: None

Old Business:

Fire Service Agreement (FSA): Chairman Leonard reviewed with the Board the company's position that they no longer want to do hall rentals. Company will continue to be the primary resident of the hall –they are still responsible for general upkeep, maintain property & grounds. Hall may be used by company members, civic groups, etc. Commissioner Bollentin motioned to accept the resolution that the amount of \$50,000 in consideration to the Volunteer Fire Company to be included in the Fire Service Agreement, seconded by Commissioner Torres. Motion passed by unanimous consent. FSA is to be for three years (20016, 2017, 2018).

Schematic Design – Station #2 bathroom design was reviewed. Kitchen range for Station #2 was reviewed. Board was in agreement that a 6-burner stove with removable griddle be included. Commissioner Bollentin motioned to approve and accept design presented on drawings for Station #2, seconded by Commissioner Torres. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

Unfinished Business:

New Business:

Cell Phone: Rich Marrero's cell phone was run over on first day of duty. Board reimbursed him for it. Discussion on policy of replacement of personal items damaged while on duty. Discussion was tabled – to be discussed again at a later meeting.

Dan Sawing Jr.: Chairman Leonard reported to the Board that he was called by Dan Sawing Jr. who requested that his LOSAP be withdrawn for medical reasons. Chairman Leonard approved the withdrawal.

Letter from JTFD #4 Firefighters Association: A letter requesting that an additional firefighter be hired for 2017 was received by the Board (a copy of

which is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference. Chairman Leonard reported to the Board that other than the amount of \$40,000 to \$50,000 has been included in the 2017 budget. Chairman Leonard would like to work out something to share his position at a future meeting. Discussion followed.

Tablets & Pagers: Lt. Reynolds advised the Board that cannot confirm where the two old tablets that were replaced are. He is going to contact Trask O'Hara to see if he still has them. After discussion, Commissioner Ruditsky stated that he would contact Trask to discuss the issue. List of pagers that have to be turned in have been submitted to the Chief and President.

Station #2 Clean up: Back room needs to be cleaned out as soon as possible in preparation for the upcoming renovation projects.

Christian McNeil: Outstanding item not yet turned in: winter jacket. He is to be contacted by Lt. Reynolds and asked to return it.

Carry money in budget to hire an additional firefighter. Chairman Leonard reviewed with the Board his position to keep money in the budget in the event that an additional firefighter is deemed necessary to hire in the future. Cheryl reviewed with the Board how the item could be listed in the budget (operational vs. administration). Commissioner Torres motioned to maintain the amount of approximately \$65,000 (includes possible salary and fringe benefits) in the 2017 budget. There was no second on the motion. Motion failed by procedure.

Public Session: None.

Adjournment: With no other business to come before the Board, Commissioner Torres motioned to accept the Resolution to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Commissioner Goldman. Motion passed by unanimous consent. Meeting adjourned at 9:08 pm.



WHEREAS, the Township and Fire Commissioners have governmental authority over the same geographic area; and



WHEREAS, there exists a need within the aforesaid geographical area for enforcement of certain parking ordinances, and such enforcement would benefit each party; and



WHEREAS, the parties are desirous of reaching an agreement for such enforcement which agreement would be mutually beneficial;


NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises exchanged herein, it is agreed as follows:
