Minutes of Meeting Held April 13, 2017

Notice of the time, date, location and agenda of this meeting to the extent then known, was duly published at least forty-eight hours in advance of this meeting, by posting on the official bulletin board and by publications in the official newspapers of the Board. This meeting is being conducted in accordance with the terms and provisions of the "Open Meetings Act" of the State of New Jersey

<u>Call to Order</u>- the meeting was called to order by Chairman Rich Leonard at 8:00 pm. "Open Meetings Act" statement was read by Board Attorney Youssouf. All participated in the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was observed.

Roll Call: Commissioners, Goldman, Jamison and Leonard, were present. Commissioner Torres was absent. Commissioner Bollentin was absent and entered the meeting at 8:45 pm.

Minutes: Commissioner Goldman motioned to approve the minutes of the March 9, 2017 Re-organization meeting as presented, seconded by Commissioner Jamison. Motion passed by unanimous vote. Minutes for the Special Meeting – March 16, 2017 were tabled (not enough participants present to vote for approval).

Treasurer's Report —The report and bill list (a copy of which is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference) as of April 13, 2017 was read by Commissioner Jamison. Commissioner Goldman motioned to approve the Treasurer's report as read and pay the bills as listed, seconded by Commissioner Jamison. Motion passed by unanimous vote.

Legal Report - Board Attorney Youssouf provided the board with a copy of a bill that was sent to him by the Ocean County Clerk's office for printing fees associated with the February 18, 2017. Bill to be given to Cheryl for payment. Board Attorney Youssouf submitted a copy of a letter to the Board that was sent to Holman, Frenia, Allison PC dated February 16, 2017 for a legal opinion on any potential claims against the Board (there are none). (A copy of the letter is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference.) Attorney Youssouf submitted a Resolution appointing Susan Pereira Board Secretary for 2017. Resolution was approved in title at the March 9, 2017. A copy of the Resolution is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference. Board Attorney Youssouf advised the Board of new legislation. In the even that a firefighter or police officer is injured in the line of duty, they cannot be terminated due to the injury sustained during the line of duty. Board Attorney Youssouf advised the Board that after missing eight consecutive meetings, note is made in the minutes by the clerk that eight meetings have been missed, a letter is sent to the elected official that they have violated the municipal vacancy law and therefore their seat has been deem vacant by operational law. All meetings count towards the number of meetings missed (special meetings).

Truck & Building/Career Department Report — read by Commissioner Goldman (a copy of which is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference). Lt. Reynolds raised the issue of #5411 — dump valve. The part was listed in specs, but it is not there. To purchase part is approximately \$1,100. No price for installation of dump valve available at this time. Board is not interested in expending money for the part at this time. Turnout gear for juniors: Lt. Reynolds and Chief Lubertazzi will research what options are available.

Chief's Report – read by Chief Lubertazzi (a copy of which is attached and incorporated herein by reference). Commissioner Jamison asked that the coverage plans (Cooksbridge Road to be closed for approximately one year) with Station #57 be memorialized in writing. Leather helmet requests were made to the board (Ernest and Lubertazzi). Board was in agreement to approve the requests.

President's Report – read by President Locklear (a copy of which is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference). Banquet Hall: FF Shane O'Brien requested use of the hall for April 16, 2017 (inadvertently omitted from the report). Junior membership application of Nicole Linde submitted to the Board. Discussion: someone to be in charge of rental hall. It has been left a mess. People who use the hall should clean it up. If there is an issue, please contact President Locklear. Someone is to be appointed as a point person. Boat Safety course (taught by the Coast Guard) is to be held here on June 10, 2017 per Lt. Reynolds.

Fire Bureau: Fire Official Burmeister reviewed his written report with the Board (a copy of which is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein by reference). FO Burmeister has written a summons. Discussion RE: summons. FO Burmeister to meet with Commissioner Jamison to review ordinance. Board Attorney Youssouf read a Resolution in Title to authorize the career staff to issue summons for violations of Township Fire code # 204. Commissioner Goldman motioned to approve FO Burmeister to attend a training class in June at Middlesex Fire Academy at a cost not to exceed \$400, seconded by Commissioner Jamison. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

Work Orders: up to date.

Old Business/Correspondence:

VFIS: correspondence advised the board that they were eligible for additional coverage at no cost to the district. No decision was reached.

Old Business:

Extrication drill at Station #2: after 2nd drill, the vehicle to be taken away for scrap.

Frank Shultz: Commissioner Goldman reported that Frank Shultz had knee surgery today. The Board has received letter and the fire company was notified in writing also.

Tablets: FO Burmeister advised that he and Trask are evaluating the current tablets.

Pool Fill: After discussion, Commissioner Jamison motioned to approve the fire company filling a pool at 397 Leesville as an exception to the rule, seconded by Commissioner Goldman. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

Nicole Linde: entered the meeting and introduced herself to the Board.

Executive Session: Commissioner Jamison motioned to accept the Resolution to take the Board into an executive session for the purpose of discussing personnel matters seconded by Commissioner Bollentin. Motion passed by unanimous consent at 8:52 p.m. Subject matter to be released when it is no longer privileged. The executive session ended at 9:42 p.m. and the Board reconvened the public session.

Plans for Station #2 – Commissioner Goldman met with the architect. Discussion. Board Attorney Youssouf advised to have the formal estimate of cost request made to the architect. Commissioners Bollentin and Jamison to review the plans one more time page by page with FF Leonard.

Possibility of cost over-run: FF Leonard advised that the cost might exceed \$500,000. Board Attorney Youssouf advised that the Board could ask public for supplemental funding if it is needed.

Pole Barn for Station #2 - Commissioner Bollentin asked for permission to start meeting with pole barn companies to start preparing for the next phase. Board was in agreement.

<u>Adjournment</u>: With no other business to come before the Board, Commissioner Bollentin motioned to accept the Resolution to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Commissioner Jamison. Motion passed by unanimous consent. Meeting adjourned 10:10 pm.


